


Social Media Highlights: 4-H

Cost



HORSE (HDC) NEWS

REGISTRATION & COGGINS DUE! All horse project members remember that your negative Coggins along with your project *registration* page (NOT the cover page of your notebook) and parent acknowledgement page are due to the MSUE office by 5:00 p.m. on May 1st.

PROJECT NOTEBOOKS: Read your notebooks and requirements. They are new this year You need to have your previous levels notebooks included. If you do not have your previous levels, you will need to complete all levels to have on entry day of the Fair (if attending).

STATE 4-H HORSE SHOW: The State 4-H Horse Show will be held August 7-9, 2015. The entry deadline is July 10, 2015 therefore **we need your application to the MSU Extension office by 5:00 p.m. on July 3rd, 2015.** Registration information will be coming soon.

LARGE MARKET LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

SWINE PICTURES, BREEDS & EAR TAGS due by May 11th at 5:00 p.m. LAMB PICTURES, BREEDS & EAR TAGS due by June 1st at 5:00 p.m.

Both swine & lamb pictures need to show the entire animal and also the ear tag, if the ear tag is not legible your leader can sign the back of it verifying the number. The easiest way to get your picture is to bring in 2 pictures, one close up of the ear and one full body shot. Each 4-H Market Livestock Project animal is required to have two ear tags (one in each ear-matching numbers). Please remember that you need to know the breed also. The office is open Mon- Fri from 8-noon and 1-5. If you are registering a second animal you need a picture with the tag & breed also. You may pick up a tag at the office after paying the \$5.00 fee. You will declare your primary at this time and have until August 11th to change to your backup if desired.

SCRAPIES IDENTIFICATION

Just as Michigan cattle require official identification to leave a premises (the RFID tag), sheep and goats also require official identification to leave a farm in the State of Michigan. The complete description and requirements can be found at the Michigan Department of Agriculture & Rural Development Animal Exhibit Division 2013 site. Per the requirements all goats and sheep moved within MI shall be identified with the official USDA scrapie program identification prior to movement off the farm. Official ID is:

- A. A USDA approved scrapie tag. Tags are available free of charge by calling 1-866-873-2824.
- B. The premises ID, obtained by calling the above number, and a unique alpha-numeric individual animal ID, legibly tattooed in the ear (right ear premises ID; left ear-individual ID) or flanks. Tattoos in the tail web are permissible in earless sheep & goats.
- C. A tattoo of the registration number from an approved breed registry, only if the number is printed on the registration certificate, and the registration certificate is with the animal. USDA must be contacted to link the registration preface with the premises ID.
- D. Electronic ID implants only in registered animals from approved breed registry where the ID number is printed on the registration certificate. The owner must present the registration certificate and have a reader present with the animal.

REPLACEMENT DATES FOR ANIMALS

The Market Livestock Project Rules state that if an animal dies or some other special problem occurs the MSUE office must be notified ASAP. A replacement animal request will only be considered after the deceased/special problem animal has been viewed by the leader, 4-H Market Livestock Committee Member or submission of a veterinarian's written explanation of the cause of death or special problem. Deadlines for requesting replacement animals are as follows:

Swine-July 1, 2015 Lambs-July 15, 2015

SMALL MARKET ANIMAL NEWS

April 1, 2015 was the registration deadline for both 4-H and Junior Market Projects. Below are the deadlines for paperwork due to the MSU Extension Office:

- Feeder Calf & Young Beef pictures, breed & RFID electronic tag numbers must be on file by June 1, 2015
- Goat pictures and tattoo numbers must be on file by August 1, 2014
- Rabbit pictures must be on file by July 31, 2015.
- Poultry pictures must be on file by July 31, 2015

** Notice the July 31st date. This is a day earlier than normal as the 1st is on a Saturday. Mark your calendars that the 31st is the deadline! **

POTENTIAL BUYERS NAMES: You have until Wednesday, August 5th to turn in your potential buyers names. You may turn them in sooner, and it is preferred that you do. Remember the following.

- 1. Your list must be submitted in person to receive a stamp & initialed by MSUE staff. You will return the original to your book.
- 2. You must have 3 different names than those of your siblings
- 3. You must have complete addresses, including zip codes, in order for us to accept them.
