Online PQA Class

Youth PQA Plus Online Training Update: For those of you that are unable to attend the PQA Training on May 21, 2014 and plan to sell your swine you must have a PQA number. At this time all youth ages 12 and older as of January 1st, 2014 will be required to complete the test accompanying the online Youth PQA Plus module, to receive their certification. If the youth does not pass the test, they will receive a ONE year certification once they have completed the process. If the youth does meet the testing requirements, they will receive a certification that expires in three years or once a change in age bracket has occurred. In order for youth to access the online system they will need to contact the Pork Check off Service Center by calling 1-800-456-7675 to register. Once your registration is completed, an email (must provide) will be sent to the youth with instructions on how to enter the online system. When the youth has received access to the system they will need to complete an online training module.
