Junior 4-H Ambassador Program Criteria

- ❖ Age: 9 – 14 on January 1 of current year
- ❖ Actively involved in an Isabella County 4-H club for two or more years, which may include Cloverbud years
- ❖ Not a previous Isabella County Junior 4-H Ambassador (previous runners-up or team members may apply)
- ❖ Request an Isabella County 4-H leader (who is not a relative) complete the Leader Recommendation Form on your behalf
- ❖ Turn in a completed hand-written Application Form, Leader Recommendation Form, and Personal Information Sheet to the 4-H Extension Office no later than 4:00pm on May 1, 2018
- ❖ Prepare a visual aid depicting your 4-H involvement, which you will share with the evaluating panel during the interview process
- ❖ Participate in an interview on June 10, 2018

Helpful Hints and Information

1. Complete the entire 4-H Ambassador Application packet – in your own hand writing; completely answer all questions listed and read each item carefully. The Leader Recommendation Form should be completed by a 4-H leader in Isabella County that knows you well, who is not a relative. These forms should be turned in to the 4-H Extension office no later than 4:00pm on May 1, 2018.
2. Complete a visual aid that shows what 4-H means to you. Bring the visual aid with you to your interview on June 10. It may include pictures/brochures from 4-H events you have attended, accomplishments at the fair, or your future 4-H plans. The display should be organized, clean, creative, and positive. You will use this as a guide through your interview. The sky is the limit! Show your style and take pride in it.
3. Participate in an interview on June 10. Dress nicely and neatly; we suggest you not wear jeans, shorts, t-shirts, tank tops, or flip flops. You want to make a very positive first impression when you step in the room to meet with the judges -- dress for success! You will have approximately nine minutes (which may increase depending on the number of applicants) in which to describe/discuss your visual aid, and the judges will ask you some questions. Practice with someone ahead of time and be yourself. Let the judges get a chance to know you, and show them why you would be a GREAT 4-H Ambassador!

Applicant Interviews

Each applicant will bring their visual aid to the assigned interview timeslot, and meet with our judges. Interviews will be held at First Church of Christ, 1610 E Broadway, Mt. Pleasant. Refreshments will be available. We recommend you plan to arrive 30 minutes before your assigned timeslot, but we also encourage everyone to attend as much of the afternoon as possible. Current 4-H Ambassadors will be available for last minute direction and prep time for interviews. We *may* also have a small community service project going on while everyone waits. Come encourage other applicants and enjoy each other's company.

Sunday, July 8, 2018, 4:00pm (which may change slightly closer to date):

Fair Kick-Off Event and 4-H Ambassador Introductions

4-H members, leaders, volunteers, and family members are encouraged to provide some last-minute cleaning and prep work at the fairgrounds. We will cap off the afternoon with a light dinner in the Grand Stand Clubhouse, at which time we will introduce the new 4-H Ambassador team. Rules, Responsibilities, and Expectations

Please read carefully and ask questions for clarification – signature indicates agreement with these terms.

1. Complete all required forms in your own hand-writing, following directions carefully.
2. All dates and times regarding the contest application process are final.
3. Fair Week Responsibilities (include but are not limited to):
 - a. Meet at 11:00am in the Food Stand the first Saturday of Fair Week.
 - b. Attend the Still Exhibit Auction, Small Animal Auction, Large Animal Auction, Talent Show, and Awards Program – these are all **required** events during fair week.
 - c. The team *may* attend one of the grand stand events, to be determined by the program coordinators.
 - d. Participate in Goat Milking, Dairy Hand Milking, Baby Calf Parade, and Pedal Pullers Competition.
 - e. Be present at small and large animal judging/showmanship events to lead pledges and pass out awards.
 - f. Participate in community service event(s) at the fairgrounds as needed.
4. Required Post-Fair Responsibilities:
 - a. Attendance at all 4-H Banquets and Fair Board Annual Meeting.
 - b. Attendance at Shepherd Maple Syrup Festival Parade.
 - c. Attendance at professional photo session as set by the 4-H Ambassador Coordinators.
 - d. TSC Clover Campaign(s) – one in the fall, one in the spring.
5. Year-Long Responsibilities (include but are not limited to): assist other 4-H members/leaders at various clinics, workshops, and educational opportunities at the discretion of the 4-H Program Coordinator, as well as complete a variety of community service projects (e.g., Clothing Inc, Rotating Homeless Shelter, HATS, Soup Kitchen, Special Olympic events, 4-H Camp Clean Up, etc.).
6. Representation of the 4-H Program is a *privilege*; all 4-H Ambassadors should present themselves in a polite, respectable, and appropriate manner at all times, before, during, and after fair.
7. Certain events will require parent/guardian participation/involvement.
8. Ambassador attire (such as member shirts) shall only be worn during scheduled ambassador group events/appearances, or when ambassadors may be individually representing 4-H or the Fair Board (such situations will be arranged through the Ambassador Coordinators).
 - a. Not on personal time.
 - b. Not while on the midway.
 - c. Not while selling in any auction.
9. All rewards/benefits (including cash prizes) are dependent upon the participation and fulfillment of each member for the entire, year-long commitment (July 2018 – July 2019).
10. Understand that it is the responsibility of the 4-H Ambassadors to make appearances during and outside of fair week; it is a year-long commitment (July 2018 – July 2019). 4-H Ambassadors will attend parades, banquets, and events to help promote the 4-H Program. They will do service projects as determined by the 4-H Ambassador Coordinators. Refer back to #3, #4, and #5 above.
11. 4-H Ambassador Program participants will be held to the 4-H Code of Conduct. Any disciplinary issues will be handled by the 4-H Program Coordinator as well as Fair Board representatives.

Applicant and Parent/Guardian Acceptance: If chosen to serve as a 4-H Ambassador, we understand and agree to the rules, expectations, and statements made throughout this application packet. Any breach of these rules, responsibilities, and expectations may result in removal from the program and forfeiture of any monetary award and/or other benefits.
