

Did you know...

- * 4-Hers are 41 percent less likely to drink, smoke or do drugs than their peers.
- * 4-Hers are 25 percent more likely to contribute to their communities than their peers.
- * 4-Hers are more likely to have at least a "B" or 3.0 average than their peers, both in high school and college.
- Young people in 4-H report better grades, higher levels of academic competence and an elevated level of engagement at school.
- * 4-Hers are nearly two times more likely to plan to go to college,
- * 4-Hers are more likely to pursue future courses or careers in science, engineering or computer technology.
- * Girls in 4-H are more than twice as likely to participate in science, engineering or computer technology programs as their peers.


