- Tuesday, October 23 (3 to 7PM)

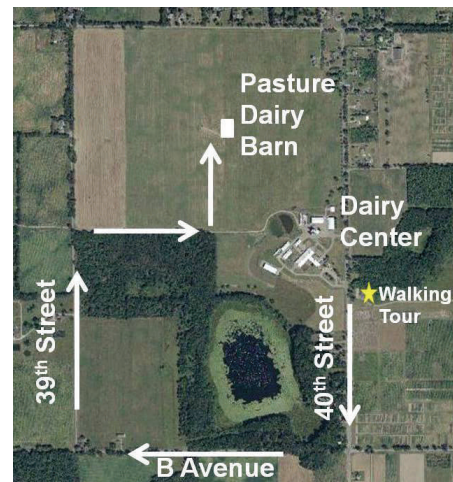
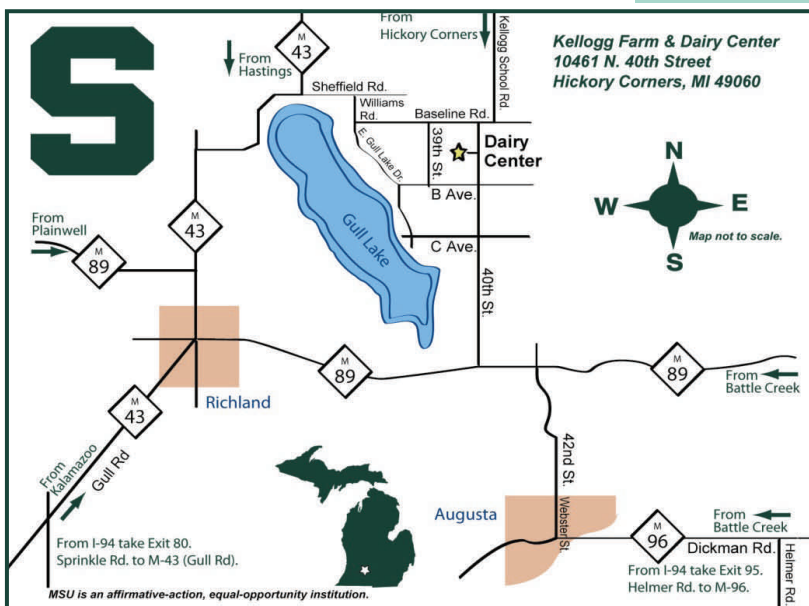
